
Welcome To

The Intensive English Program is located on the University of Miami Coral Gables campus. Coral Gables is a Mediterranean styled suburb filled with acclaimed restaurants, fine art galleries, live theater, breathtaking flora, and a bevy of landmarks on the National Register of Historic Places.

Victor Dupuy is from France and is enrolled in the IEP Level 4.




Khaled


HOW TO APPLY

Steps to Apply

1. Visit www.miami.edu/iep and click on "Apply Now"
2. Complete the IEP application
3. Prepare the supporting documents:
 - a. Non-refundable/non-transferable application fee of US \$125
 - b. Passport ID page for applicant and dependent
 - c. Copy of original bank letter and/or scholarship letter
4. Scan and email the application requirements to iep@miami.edu
